Timetabling

Individual lessons are scheduled at a time between 8.30am and 8.30pm from Monday to Friday, and 8.30am to 4pm on Saturdays.

Group lessons are scheduled where the collaborative allocation of members are appropriate (e.g. age, ability, style).
